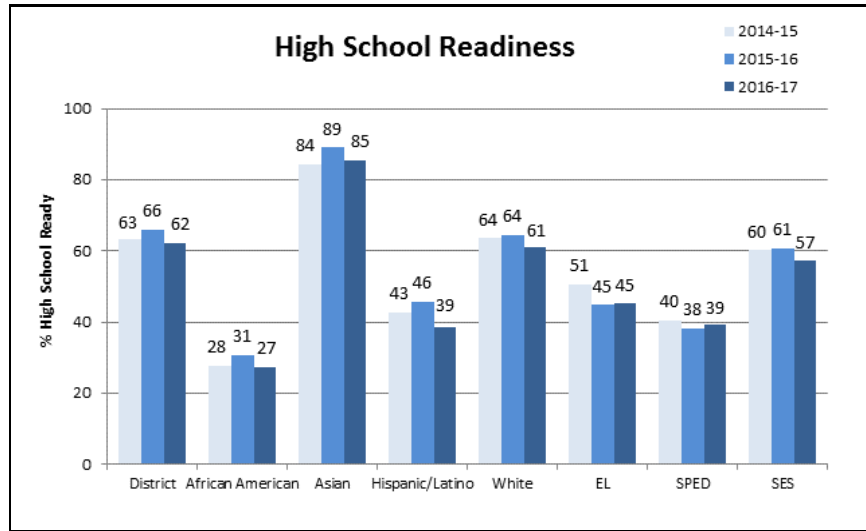


High School Readiness (Gr 8)

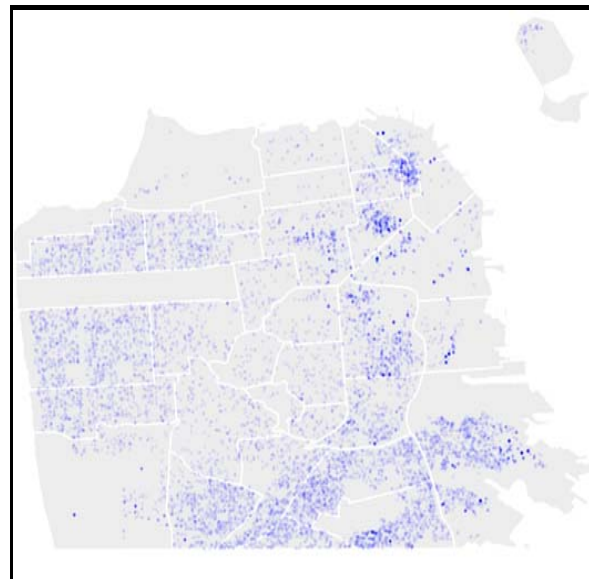

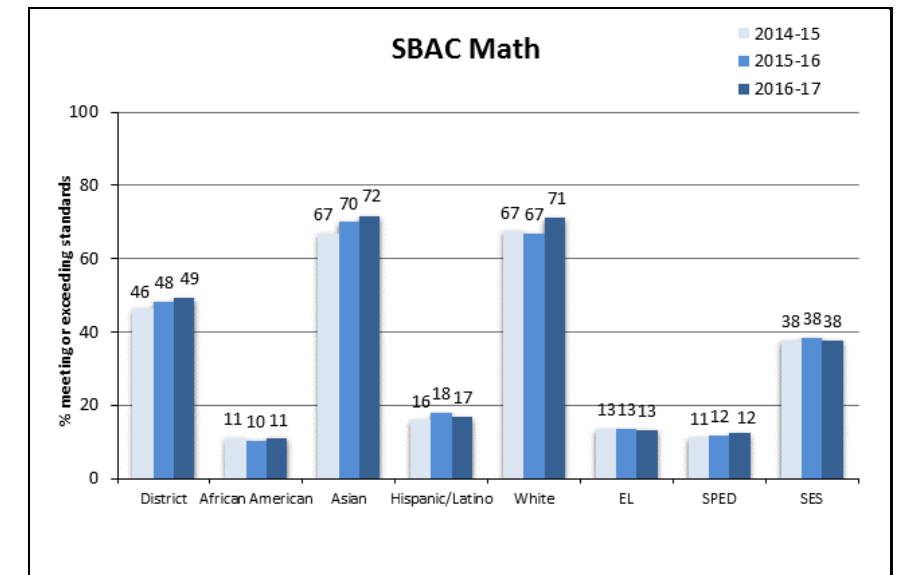

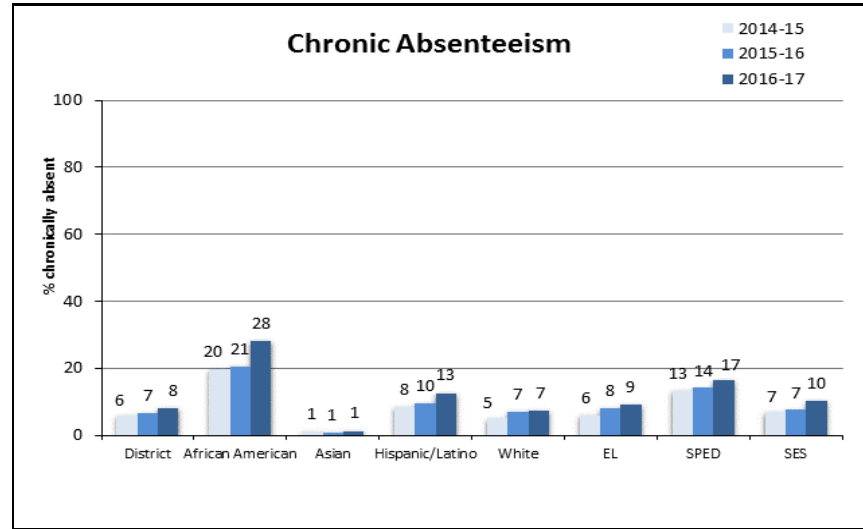

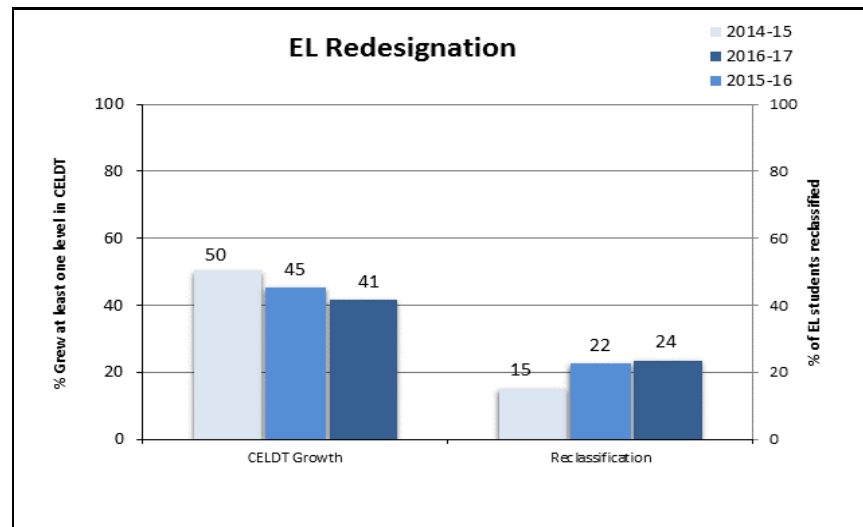
