PUBLIC EDUCATION ENRICHMENT FUND IMPACT 2010

Athletics:

(1) Since 2005, the number of coaches paid through PEEF funds increased from 20 to 216 in 2009.

(2) Since 2005, the number of bus trips provided for student athletes to and from sports events increased from 340 to 836 in 2009.

Physical Education:

(1) Since 2006, the number of P.E. teachers increased from 0 to 20.2 FTE in 2008.

(2) Since 2005, the number of professional development for elementary classroom teachers increased from 0 to 40 in 2008.

Libraries:

(1) Since 2005, teacher librarians drastically increased from 5.5 FTE to 53 FTE in 2009.

(2) Since 2005, 56 library facilities have been remodeled at underserved school sites.

Arts & Music:

(1) Since 2005, the number of elementary art coordinators at school sites increased from 0 to 103 out of 106 total schools in 2009.

(2) Since 2005, the number of secondary level art classes offered increased from 516 to 1065 in 2009.

Career Technical Education:

(1) Since 2005, the number of high school seniors completing 2 City College San Francisco courses increased from 0 to 150 in 2009.

Custodial Services:

(1) Since 2007, every Child Development Centers (37 centers) have received at least one deep cleaning per year.

Formative Assessments:

(1) Since 2005, the number of students participating in English Language Arts, Math, History, and Science common assessments increased 67% (from 13,763 to 23,000 in 2008).

Peer Resources:

(1) Since 2006, the number of students participating in peer mentoring, peer tutoring, and peer support groups increased 75% (from 932 to 1631 in 2009)

Teacher Academy:

(1) Last year (2008), 42 algebra math classes have been served by Teacher Academy teacher's aides.

Teacher Recruitment:

(1) From fall 2007 to spring 2009, a 74% (from 46 to 12) decrease of teacher vacancies on the 1st day of school have occurred.

Translation & Interpretation:

(1) Since 2006, the number of pages translated (in Chinese, Spanish, Tagalog, Russian, Vietnamese, Arabic, and Samoan) more than tripled from 1489 to 4544 in 2009.

Student Support Professionals:

(1) Since 2005, the ratio of Student Support Professionals in elementary schools increased from 1 for every 1207 students to 1 for every 680 students in 2008.

Wellness Centers:

(1) Since 2007, the number of students accessing Wellness services at 4 PEEF funded fully staffed high school Wellness Centers increased 28% from 1041 to 1330 in 2009.
